

## **Brion-Meisels Clip 8**

*[These facilitator notes provide commentary and ideas that might be helpful as you use these raw video clips with other educators.]*

Share-outs are valuable, but in our experience, they can often drag on and become redundant. It's useful to have different share-out techniques at your disposal that strike this balance. Here, Brion-Meisels asks each group if they have something to share out, and the groups that do share seem to keep their share-outs quite pithy. Brion-Meisels also volunteers to print up and share out any notes, which is yet another way for people not in a small group to learn from a given small group conversation. We also note that Brion-Meisels highly praises a student for innovative thinking, and calls on that student specifically to share out her 2x2 matrix. We find it is a good use of small group time for the instructor to listen for ideas that are worth bringing into the share-out. What's your experience with share-outs?
